One Solution: Health Impact Assessment

A **systematic** process that uses an array of data sources and analytic methods, and **considers input from stakeholders** to determine the **potential effects** of a **proposed** policy, plan, program, or project on the **health of a population and the distribution** of those effects within the population. HIA **provides recommendations** on monitoring and **managing** those effects.

Key Goals of Health Impact Assessment

Primary:

- Identify +/- health impacts of a proposal
- Highlight health disparities
- Make health a key factor in decision making
- Create decisions based on scientific evidence
- Provide recommendations to improve health

Additional Goals

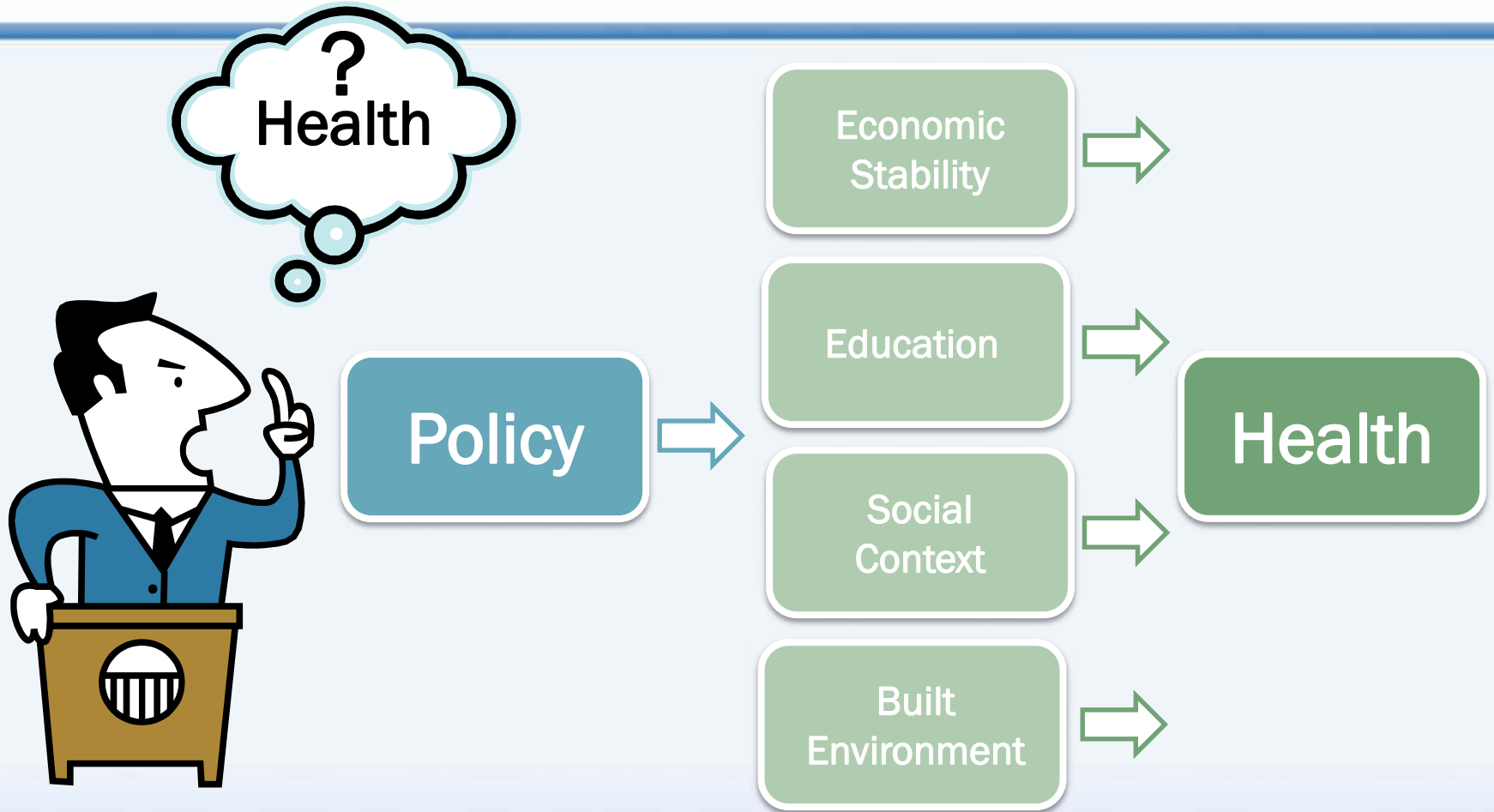
- Build relationships
- Engage impacted groups and decision makers
 - Increase transparency in decision making

HIA is NOT intended to:

- Make the case why a policy, program or project should or should not be proposed
- Assess impacts once program has been implemented
- Evaluate a program to make improvements
- Assess community needs*

*HIA is always connected to a decision that is being considered

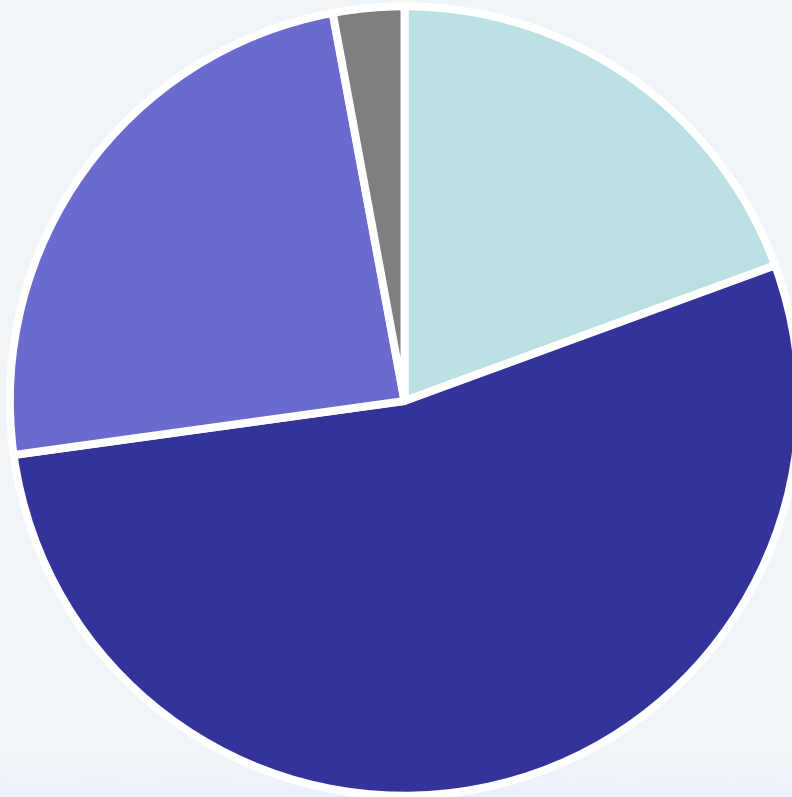

Application of HIA

- **Types of decision making**
 - Policy Decisions (e.g. bills by state legislature)
 - Policy Implementation (e.g. weigh various implementation options for a policy once it is passed)
 - Project-Specific (e.g. siting, permitting, construction, design)
 - Comprehensive Plans (e.g. regional growth plans)

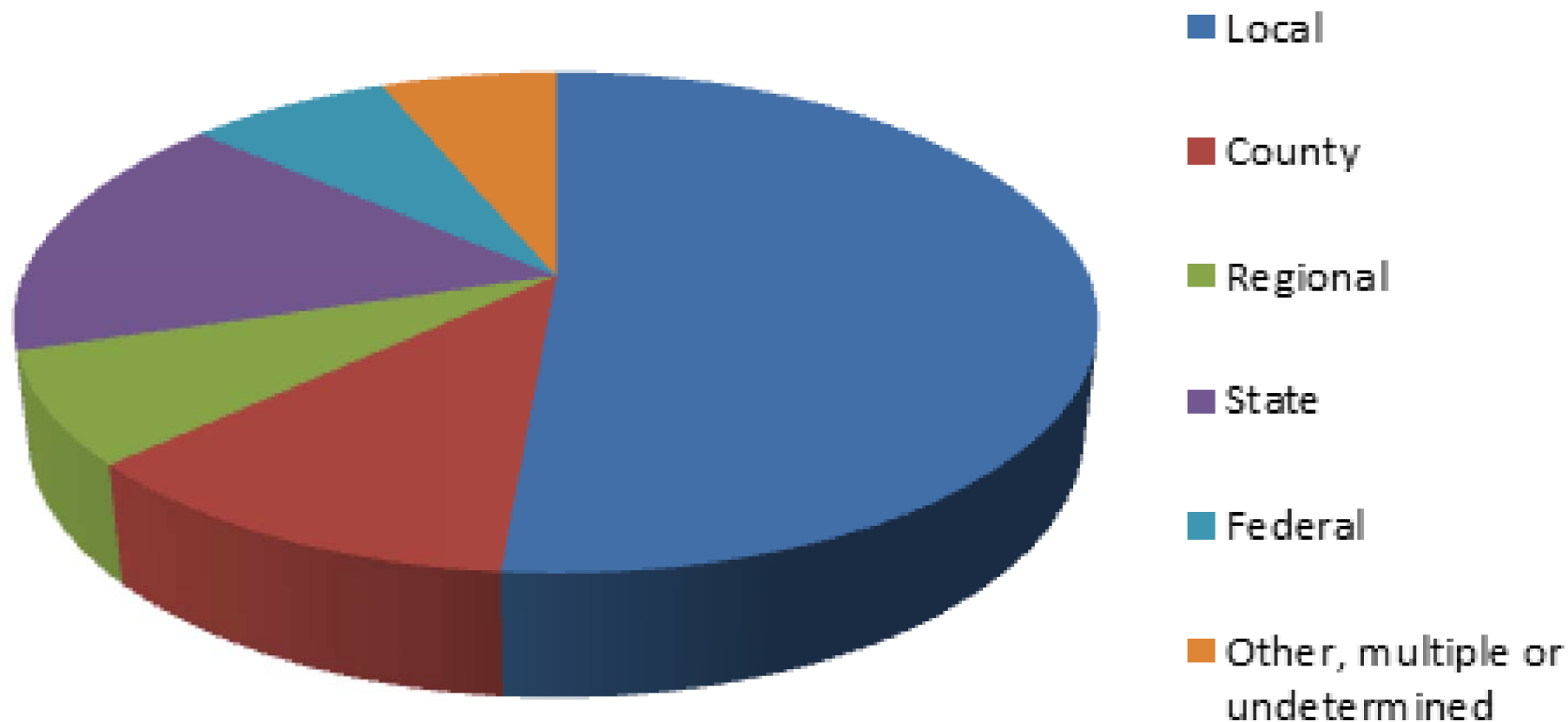

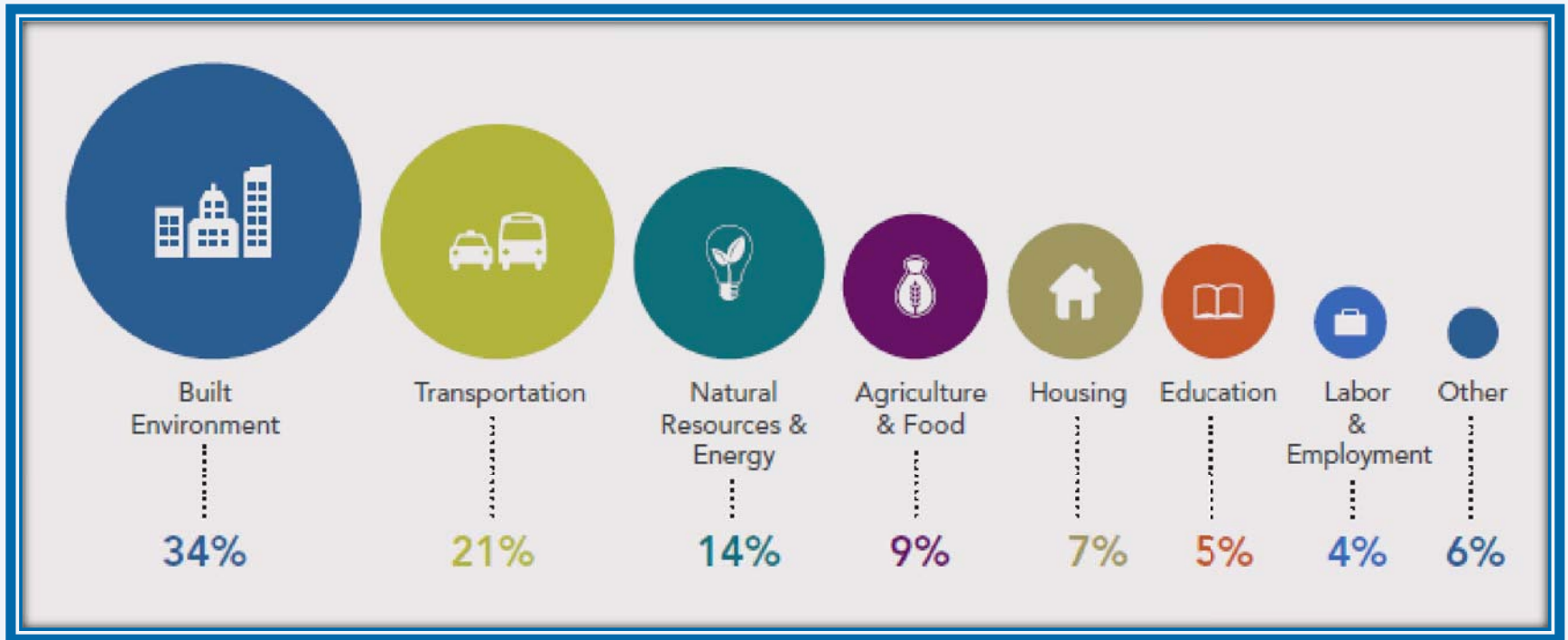

HIAs are used to inform decisions at what levels?

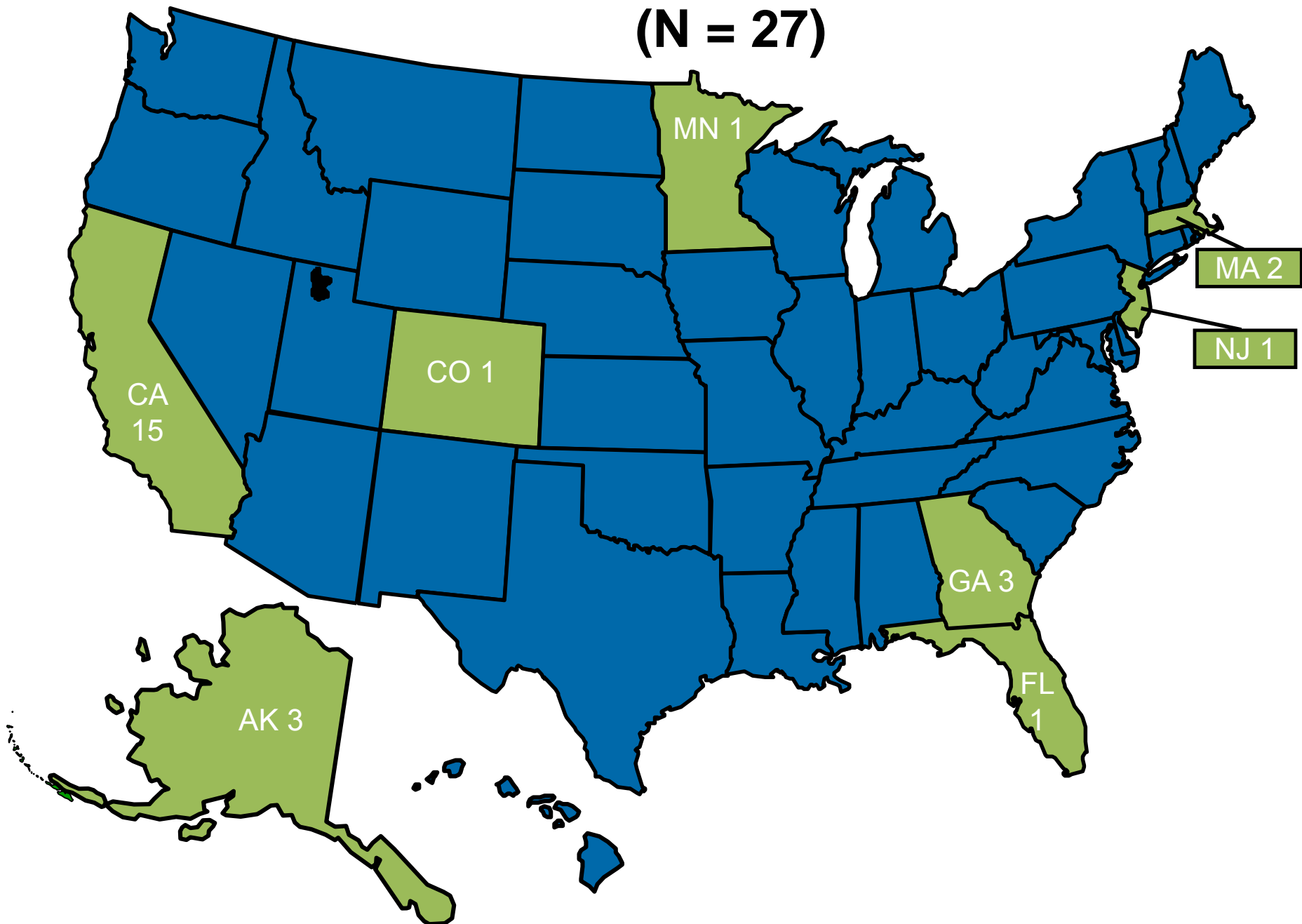


What topics have HIAs addressed?



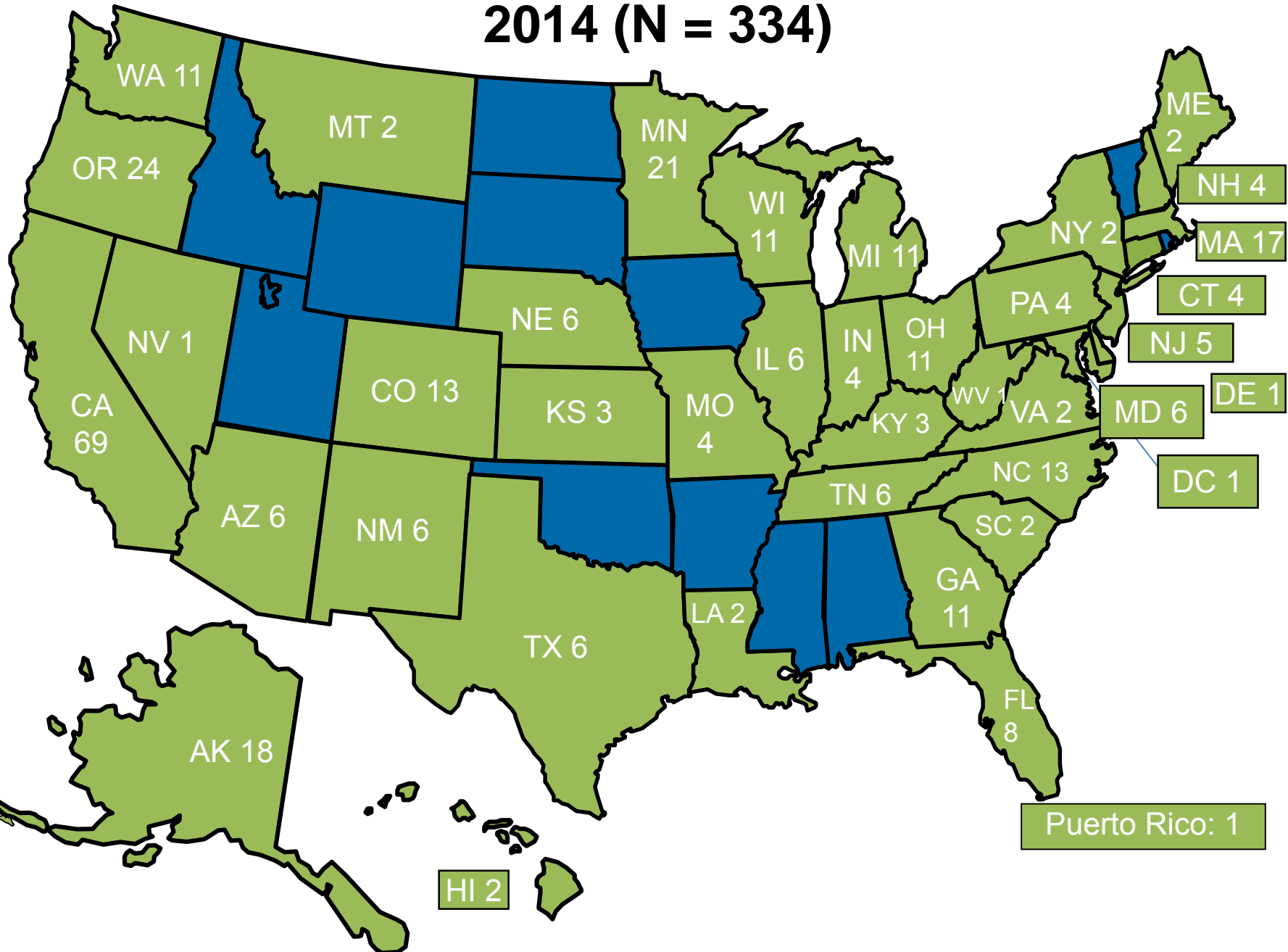
Completed HIAs 2007

How Do You Define “Success” In HIA?

- ***Informed the decision*** – “HIA recommendations were 100% adopted into the growth plan”
- ***“New partnerships*** between health and other agencies”
- ***A culture change*** – “It brought health concerns into the discussion; decision-makers/planning department now routinely thinking about health”
- ***“Addressed community concerns”***
- ***“Educated decision-maker*** about how a policy that seemed to have nothing to do with health, actually has health consequences”
- ***Increasing community awareness about HIA*** and about how to use the results in their advocacy efforts”
